The Nature of Temptation

- Stones to bread cut corners to make life comfortable
- Jump off the temple take a shortcut to success
- Worship Satan compromise to gain power
- All are trying to separate Jesus' power from love

The Appeal of Temptation

- They speak to the deep desires of our hearts
 - Idol anything or anyone that takes God's place in your heart
 - Money, job, sex, good family, etc. are "surface idols"
 - "Deep idols" (such as comfort, success, and power) drive us to pursue surface idols

The Appeal of Temptation

- Temptation speaks to our deepest fears
 - "If I don't look out for myself, who will look out for me?"
- Temptation invites us to skip the cross
 - It promises the comfort, success, and power God wants to give us without suffering on the way

The Defeat of Temptation

- Every time Jesus faces temptation, He quotes the Bible
 - His desire for God is deeper than His desire for idols
- Jesus is confident His Father will fight for Him if He refuses to fight for Himself
- Jesus is committed to following God's path for Him, even if it involves death

The Defeat of Temptation

- We get power to resist temptation by looking to Jesus as our Messiah
- Seeing what Jesus did for us fills us with love for Him that robs idols, fear, and temptation of their power
