

Speak God's Words

- David turns to Nathan for advice because he trusts Nathan
- Nathan has a sensitivity to hearing God's voice and a humility that lets him admit when he's wrong
- Nathan is willing to speak God's truth, even when it's bad news

Speak in Ways that Connect

- Each time Nathan interacts with David, he uses a different way of presenting the truth
- He tailors his speaking to forms that will be heard, understood, and acted upon properly in each situation

Pursue Your Good

- Nathan truly cares about David and wants what's good for him
- Nathan takes action that is dangerous to himself in order to help David

Seeking Advisors Today

- Fear of the Lord the key ingredient that sets a godly advisor apart from a regular advisor
- God Himself, in Jesus, the Wonderful Counselor, is our greatest advisor
 - Jesus is God's word made flesh
 - He becomes human so we can connect with Him
 - Jesus lays down His life to seek our good
