

The Quest for Greatness

 We seek to prove our greatness by comparing ourselves with others, like the disciples "According to Christian teachers, the essential vice, the utmost evil, is Pride. Unchastity, anger, greed, drunkenness, and all that, are mere flea bites in comparison: it was through Pride that the devil became the devil. Pride leads to every other vice: it is the complete anti-God state of mind."

The Quest for Greatness

- We seek to prove our greatness by comparing ourselves with others, like the disciples
- Pride: Having an excessive view of your own importance that leads you to look down on others

"Pride gets no pleasure out of having something, only out of having more of it than the next person. We say that people are proud of being rich, or clever, or good-looking, but they are not. They are proud of being richer, or cleverer, or better-looking than others. If everyone else became equally rich, or clever, or good-looking there would be nothing to be proud about."

The Steps to Greatness

- True greatness comes from loving and serving those who have nothing to offer us
- Jesus breaks the greatness game by eliminating the competition
- Jesus' goal is heart transformation, not just behavior change
- Being on Jesus' side is the only way to be free from the world's greatness game

The Key to Greatness

- Jesus lets Himself be arrested and killed so we can be set free from the world's greatness game
- Faith in Jesus means we are already great in God's eyes
