
1 John: So That You May Not Sin

1 John 2:1-6



Those who know God seek to obey Him.

The Goal

- John writes "so that you may not sin" (v. 1)
- Sin: the attitude that sees ourselves at the center of the universe AND the actions that come from that attitude
- Perfection is impossible, but growth is expected

Provision for Failure

- All Christians will sin, but sin should be the exception rather than the rule for Christians
- Jesus is God's provision for our sin
 - He is our advocate who pleads our case before God
 - He is righteous, so He can stand between perfect God and sinful humanity
 - He is our propitiation who bears God's wrath so we can go free

"[Propitiation] is an appeasement of the wrath of God by the love of God through the gift of God."

A Test

- Obedience
- It is possible to know God (and to know that you know God)
- We can know that we truly know God when we keep His commandments
- True spiritual experiences lead to life transformation

- "In him truly the love of God is perfected" (v. 5)
