

"The decision [to leave my job and care for her] was made, in a way, 42 years ago when I promised to care for Muriel "in sickness and in health...till death do us part." She has cared for me fully and sacrificially all these years; if I cared for her for the next 40 years I would not be out of her debt. Duty, however, can be grim and stoic. But there is more: I love Muriel... I don't have to care for her. I get to! It is a high honor to care for so wonderful a person."




