


Matthew 5:4

Why We Don't Mourn

- 3 reasons we tend to avoid mourning: 1. Pursuit of happiness as main approach to life 2. Stoicism: Life is hard, so deal with it and don't
- - show emotion
 - 3. Cynicism: Life is hard, and then you die, so there's no point in crying elements of truth, but it's partial truth Matthew 5:4
- They all have power because they contain

The Meaning of Mourning

- There is a wrong type of mourning that is rebelling against God, and Jesus isn't referring to that mourning
- What Jesus calls us to mourn:
 - 1. Our own sin
 - 2. The sin of others
 - 3. The effects of sin

Learning to Mourn
